Negotiating a Good End: Confronting Conflict at the Bedside



A recent hospital-wide survey identified conflict as the number one issue requiring further education. Conflict frequently arises around end of life care. Conflict can occur between families and medical caregivers, as well as between family members themselves. The clinical ethicist is often called in when it appears that all avenues of communication have been exhausted. This presentation will discuss the role of clinical ethics as mediation, and strategies to minimize conflict and reach consensus.
